

Pioneer settlers in Indian Rocks and neighboring areas discovered early on that the climate and soil were well adapted to citrus growing.

Orange and grapefruit trees planted on the first farms were forerunners of the thousands of acres of citrus groves that would reign as the region's leading crop and industry until the real estate boom following World War II.

Citrus was a cash crop, and most of the prominent pioneer families were involved. Well-known growers included J. S. Hill, the Wilcox brothers, Warren Hammock and Harry Ulmer. The Whitehursts and McMullens also included citrus growing along with their other pursuits.

By the early 1900s, the area east of today's Walsingham and Belleair Causeway bridges were covered by orange and grapefruit trees.

The Wilcox family founded Wilcox Brothers Tropical Acres and Groves on 40 acres of land in the Anona area. The thriving citrus farm included a nursery and landscaping business. Though the citrus groves were eventually sold to developers, Wilcox Nursery and Florists continues to operate at its original location along Indian Rocks Road.

The area's earliest commercial grower J. S. Hill, started his citrus operation with 15 acres along Oakhurst Road in 1915, later expanding to 40 acres. In 1936, Hill built a fruit packing plant at 10900 Oakhurst Road. The building is now a furniture/craft store, still owned by the Hill family.

The most famous local citrus grower was Harry Ulmer, who established Indian Rocks Fruits in the 1920s, headquartered at the corner of Walsingham and Indian Rocks Road (where Walgreen's sits today). Ulmer's groves were located just north of the J. S. Hill groves.

Ulmer opened his fruit packing plant in the 1940s. He later added a gift shop and the famous Palm Garden Restaurant.

Fruit groves dominated the landscape of mainland Indian Rocks, and citrus growing was the #1 economic pursuit in the largely agricultural Pinellas County throughout the first half of the 20th Century. The colorful labels of the area citrus growers were a common sight in markets and produce stores all over the frozen North every winter season - vivid reminders of the beckoning Florida sunshine. Even disastrous freezes in the 1920s barely put a dent in the industry's remarkable growth.

Citrus was King until the years following World War II, when a booming real estate market spawned a large-scale conversion of grove land to more profitable home sites. Killing freezes of the 1960s finished off what remained of the once dominant industry.

Yellow Banks Groves' retail store on Walsingham is a last reminder of the groves that once stretched for miles across the landscape.







# **CAUGHT IN IRB**

October 13th, Leonardo Riera, caught this 175 pound Tarpon from shore off of Eight Ave. He was using Spanish Mack as a bait, on a 20 lb test line, and fought him about 1 hr and 45 min. The Florida Tarpon Fish Record is 243 lbs. The fish anglers target are females, who exceed 200 or even 250 pounds. Males seldom get bigger than 140 pounds. Tarpon spawn on a new or full moon, way offshore. A female may spawn 4- to 20-million eggs a year for 25 or 30 years.

Requirements for Citizen Patrol applicants are:


• Must be a citizen of the United States


• Must be at least 18 years of age














# THE BEACH ART CENTER





# SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATES

Ever notice the license plates with a turtle, manatee, or Buc's logo? Or regular plates with a word or name?

What does it cost? Everyone pays the basic price for the plate. It varies with the type of your vehicle i.e.. car, truck, etc. The price is from \$28 to \$60 a year.

Specialties Plates, with a logo on the left, can vary depending on the type of vehicle you drive. They range from \$15 to \$27 extra.

Add a Word? That will cost you \$29 extra. On a regular plate you are limited to 7 characters. Some specialty plates limited you to 5 characters. For license plates with center graphic, you have to allow two spaces for the logo, or the characters will cover the graphic.

In total some people may be paying over \$100 to have a logo and their name on their license plate.







# PINELLAS SUNCOAST FIRE & RESCUE

The Pinellas Suncoast Fire & Rescue is a state chartered fire district providing services to the Gulf Coast communities of Indian Rocks Beach, Indian Shores, Belleair Beach and Belleair Shore? We also serve a portion of unincorporated Pinellas County extending east from the Intracoastal Waterway to 131 Street, south from Walsingham Road to 94 Avenue. In addition, we provide paramedic rescue services to the towns of Redinaton Beach, North Redinaton Beach and Redington Shores.

PSFRD provides service from stations located at 304 First Street, Indian Rocks Beach; 13501 - 94th Avenue on the mainland; and 18399 Gulf Boulevard in Indian Shores. The Fire District has its own governing board of five commissioners elected from the city or town on the beach they represent with two members elected from districts on the mainland.

The District operates three paramedic staffed fire units that had 2.459 calls over the last nine months-an average of almost nine calls per day. The District provides fire-safety inspection services to the area with two full-time inspectors on staff. Five additional state certified inspectors on response units support them.

The calls our Department handles varies from false alarms to hurricane and disaster preparation, marine rescue, vehicle extrication, hazard mitigation, fires and trauma incidents. We responded to a structure fire on the corner of 20th Avenue and Gulf Blvd. in which the resident decided to burn a portion of a telephone pole in the fireplace. The intense heat penetrated the wall into the adjacent apartment involving it in the fire. By using our thermal imagery to locate the source of the fire, the result was minimal damage to the apartments.

Unfortunately, vehicle accidents are common. We responded to a motorcycle accident on the Indian Rocks Bridge in which the driver of the motorcycle may have been intoxicated. Upon our arrival, the driver was killed upon impact, but the female passenger was still alive. Our crews administered Advance Life Support (ALS) until Bayflight arrived; due to the severity of her head injuries, she was also a fatality.

Whatever the situation might be, Pinellas Suncoast Fire & Rescue is here to provide service to our communities.
